Five Shadows of a Greater Gospel

- 1. There is a sovereign God with a saving plan.*
- 2. Salvation requires a substitutionary sacrifice for sin.*
- 3. Salvation requires a heavenly and human mediator, redeemer, and intercessor.*
- 4. Salvation will come through a righteous and suffering servant.*
- 5. Salvation will result in resurrection life.*
