Therefore, our service follows the pattern God gave his people thousands of years ago: God speaks and we respond.

If you have any questions from the sermon you can return to the sanctuary about 15 minutes after the service for our *Ask the Pastor* time. This is a great place to process the wonderful truths of the Gospel that we proclaim.

Don't worry, we won't bombard you with endless emails. We just want an opportunity to say hello. If there is any way that we can pray for you, or if you have questions about the church, you can write those on the back as well.

A Word to Parents with Young Children

First, we want you to know that we are delighted to have your children in worship with us this morning. We also have an overflow room with a livestream of the service in the downstairs fellowship hall. Lastly, we have a *nursery* downstairs for children ages 0-3. Staff in the nursery are background checked and trained.




