Don't worry, we won't bombard you with endless emails. We just want an opportunity to say hello. ### A Word to Parents with Young Children

First, we want you to know that we are delighted to have your children in worship with us this morning. Any noises that they may make are not an embarassing distraction,but a beautiful reminder that they are participating in God's means of grace.

We do understand, however, that it is sometimes helpful to have other means of serving our children and families. Through the back doors of the sanctuary you will find a cry room if you have little ones that are getting fussy or who need to nurse. We also have an overflow room with a livestream of the service in the downstairs fellowship hall. Lastly, we have a *nursery* downstairs for children ages 0-3. Staff in the nursery are background checked and trained.
